


A Survivor's Story


The Right to Play

How Jane Addams Fought for America's Playgrounds

She didn't just build a playground; she built a movement.

When Jane Addams was a girl, a limp prevented her from running and playing with the other children in her neighborhood. Eventually, her condition improved, but she never forgot what it felt like to be left out. Jane grew up and moved to Chicago to cofound Hull House, a settlement home for immigrant families. There, children from different countries spent time together while their parents worked. Jane wanted to give the boys and girls in her care a place outside where they could run and play, just as she used to. So she commissioned the first model playground in the US, sparking a nationwide movement to build safe, dedicated spaces for children of all abilities to play.







Finally, it's here!


Freddie Ramos Cracks the Case
